("I have a question.")

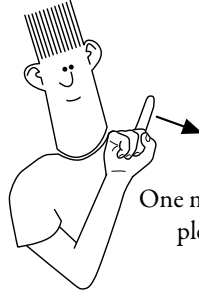


The letter "A"

comment.

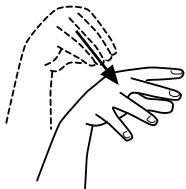


May I use

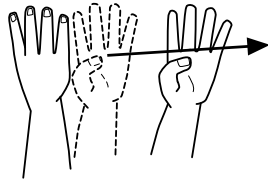


One moment,

Lights off.



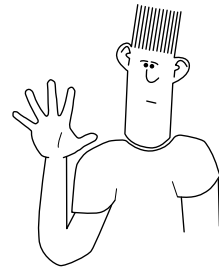
Lights on.

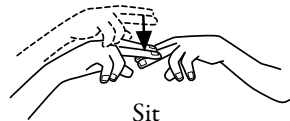

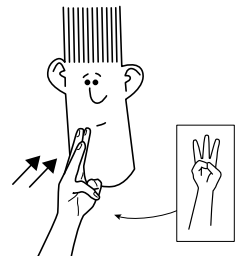

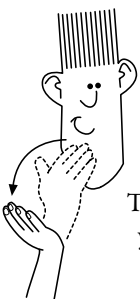
Dear Visiting Teacher,
